

Hiking to Ross Lake Resort

Reminders:

- There is no cell service in the area; make all arrangements before starting your adventure
- There is no store or restaurant at the Resort
- Be prepared for the outdoors; conditions in the mountains change quickly!

Hiking – Alternate Option

- You can also hike to the Resort by turning left on the gravel road and then hike across the top of the dam
- On the other side of the dam, follow the Big Beaver trail for approximately 1 mile and take the turnoff (marked with a trail sign) to Ross Lake Resort
- This alternate route adds an additional 2.5 miles to your hike

Parking

- Park at the “Ross Dam Trailhead” parking area at milepost 134 on Highway 20
- For security, do not leave valuables in the car (leave nothing visible)

Hiking

- Hike down trail (approximately 1 mile) until it meets the gravel road (Note: the trail is steep. Be prepared!)
- Turn RIGHT on the gravel road and follow the road approximately a quarter of a mile to where it meets the lake
- If you have a reservation at the Resort, including our water taxi service, equipment rental, or are a guest of the resort, use the phone on the last power pole off the side of the road to call the Resort office. There is a post on the road that points to the phone location & there are instructions in the phone box on how to use the phone
- Those with reserved Water Taxi reservations will be picked-up from the dock and transported up the lake to their destination
- Those with equipment or cabin rentals will be picked-up at the dock for a quick boat-ride across the lake to the Resort (boat ride is \$3 each way per person)
- Please keep the dock clear of people and gear until our boat arrives to pick-up your party
